This three-year series of educational workshops provides psychiatric educators the additional skills needed to be effective leaders in health professional education in psychiatry. If you have never attended, this is your chance to enroll in a “mini-masters” in education and develop your core knowledge and skills in essential subject areas for educators. Previous topics have included educational methods, negotiations, education theory, leading change, learner assessment, leading through crisis, educational scholarship, and curriculum design. The 2023 Fall Session will cover *Learning Theories* and *Program Evaluation*.

Returning registrants earn additional hours toward a Master Educator certificate. The series is split into two 3-hour sessions. Registrants are expected to attend both Master Educator sessions offered during the Annual Meeting. Enrollment is limited to 40 participants.

To enable completion of certificate requirements, we will reserve space for previous years’ applicants until July 1st.
